"This is a true saying, If a man desire the office of a bishop, he desireth a good work." 1 Timothy 3:1 A pastoral candidate's calling and equipping will be validated by church "Now there were in the church that was at Antioch certain prophets and teachers; as Barnabas, and Simeon that was called Niger, and Lucius of Cyrene, and Manaen, which had been brought up with Herod the tetrarch, and Saul. As they ministered to the Lord, and fasted, the Holy Ghost said, Separate me Barnabas and Saul for the work whereunto I have called them. And when they had fasted and prayed, and laid their hands on them, they sent them away." Acts 13:1-3 God often doesn't call the equipped, but he equips the called. Ministry calling will be a powerful reminder of one's when times get difficult. Pastoral ordination is the formal pastoral ministry. "Neglect not the gift that is in thee, which was given thee by prophecy, with the laying on of the hands of the presbytery." 1 Timothy 4:14 "For this cause left I thee in Crete, that thou shouldest set in order the things that are wanting, and ordain elders in every city, as I had appointed thee:" Titus 1:5 : Appointing, consecrating, or commissioning of persons for special service to the Lord and His people. These words come from the Latin ordinare, meaning "to set in order, arrange, organize." In later Latin they came to mean "to appoint to office."

Old Testament Precedents for Ordination The consecration of Aaron and his sons as priests to God (Exod. 28–29; Lev. 8–9)
The dedication of the Levites as servants of God (Num. 8:5–14) The appointment of 70 elders to assist Moses (Num. 11:16–17, 24–25)
The commissioning of Joshua as Moses' successor (Num. 27:18–23).
In the New Testament, pastors are ordained by
churches. One does not take the role of pastor by simply graduating college, taking over a role in the church or by simply giving a title.
The ordination council determines that the pastoral candidate meets the requirements of the pastoral office.
The council not only ensures doctrinal fidelity, but examines character, as well. "And when they had ordained them elders in every church, and had prayed with fasting, they commended them to the Lord, on whom they believed." Acts 14:23
